## **REVIEW OF THE WEEK**

Once again there was little football played in the Premier Division but all the games that did survive were pivotal with BRADFORD PARK AVENUE's home win against MARINE taking them to top spot on goal difference from RETFORD UNITED along with two games in hand. Last week's second place side BOSTON UNITED slipped to third when they made the long trip to KENDAL TOWN only to succumb to the Lake District side's unbeaten home record with Dave Foster scoring the only goal of the game. GUISELEY's midweek win over BUXTON saw them move in to the play-off spots whilst the other two top tier matches had a big bearing on the opposite end of the table. The midweek clash between FC UNITED of MANCHESTER and FRICKLEY ATHLETIC was vital to both sides to put some distance between themselves and the two relegation slots but whilst the goalless scoreline appeared at first glance to be of little use to either side it did move them both up above MATLOCK TOWN. Then on Saturday United edged out bottom club DURHAM CITY 2-1 to suddenly find themselves in 15<sup>th</sup> place.

After winning thirteen league games on the bounce LANCASTER CITY visited WOODLEY SPORTS where they have a poor record which didn't improve with a 4-1 defeat and their lead at the top of the table was reduced to three points when COLWYN BAY took full advantage of HARROGATE RAILWAY's poor away form (they still have to win on the road) to register a 2-0 win. SKELMERSDALE UNITED consolidated their play-off hopes with a home win in midweek over BAMBER BRIDGE for whom 2010 has been a disaster with four straight defeats whilst sixth place side LEIGH GENESIS were conceding ground with a goalless draw at WARRINGTON TOWN who won at the weekend against AFC FYLDE to go seventh.

After the midweek games six First Division South clubs went in to Saturday's fixtures separated by just one point and although only game fell foul of the weather in this Division the afternoon finished with five clubs still only one point apart. The one side to drop three points was probably considered one of the day's bankers but after beating leaders CHASETOWN in midweek BELPER TOWN went down to next bottom SPALDING UNITED. All the other five sides won with the leaders bouncing back to edge past CAMMELL LAIRD whilst MICKLEOVER SPORTS, GLAPWELL and RUSHALL OLYMPIC also only had one goal margins to play with. There was a more comfortable 3-0 success for SHEFFIELD FC at bottom club WILLENHALL TOWN who are now six games since they last found the net. WITTON ALBION joined the party with six points on the road in the week to go level with Belper but KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC, leaders at the turn of the year, are now down to eighth as they still look, not only for a first point in 2010, but also a first goal.

## **UNIBOND " CLUB OF THE MONTH" AWARDS**

The UniBond "Club of the Month awards for January have gone to GUISELEY, LANCASTER CITY and BELPER TOWN.

Guiseley enjoyed a 100% record in the month with their two league victories supplemented with success away at Blyth Spartans in the FA Trophy whilst Boston United's 100% record went when they lost 1-0 at Kendal Town today. Lancaster took the First Division North prize for the second month in succession despite their 100% record vanishing in to thin air at Woodley Sports also today. The Giant Axe side had already done enough to land the spoils with five straight wins earlier in the month. The First Division South accolade went the way of Belper Town despite their defeat today at Spalding United as they had won all three of their previous games in January including a victory on Tuesday evening at table-topping Chasetown.

### **FA "GROUNDSMAN OF THE YEAR AWARDS**

The UniBond League this week announced its five nominations to represent the League in this season's FA "Groundsman of the Year" competition. Belper Town's Phil Varney, who has been second and third nationally in the last two seasons, is again amongst the contenders and is joined by Elfed Morris who came second in the national awards last year in addition to winning the UniBond section. Boston United's Keith Crostan who narrowly missed out on selection last year makes it this time round together with Mark Freeman from Loughborough Dynamo and Trafford's Graham Foxall.

### **EARLY KICK OFFS FOR MOSSLEY**

Having had two of their floodlight pylons come down under the combination of the weight of the recent snow and high winds Mossley have now completed the felling of the remaining six pylons after they too were found by a structural report to be unsafe. As a result of this the League has agreed that until further notice all Mossley's Saturday home fixtures will kick off at 2pm whilst neighbours Ashton United have agreed to host their neighbour's midweek games.

### **WILLCOCK RESIGNS AT MOSSLEY**

As if their floodlighting problems were not enough to be going on with Mossley were further rocked this week when manager Chris Willcock informed the club he was quitting to take up the position as Assistant Manager at Stalybridge Celtic where that club's number two Benny Phillips has just been made caretaker boss following the departure of Steve Burr. With Phillips only in a caretaker role at the moment it is a risky choice to make by Willcock but he felt he had to take the opportunity to move up two Divisions to further his ambitions within the game.

Former Woodley Sports boss John Flanagan, latterly Willcock's assistant at Mossley, has agreed to take charge of team affairs for the foreseeable future giving the club some stability and continuity at a difficult time.

### **HUCKNALL SHOCK AS CHAMBERS QUILTS**

Hucknall Town boss Bryan Chambers this week informed the club that he was standing down for personal reasons ending a fourteen month spell at Watnall Road. He had first linked up with Hucknall in November 2008 as Director of Football before becoming manager when he replaced twin managers Mick Galloway and Andy Miller.

Chambers could not prevent Hucknall from relegation but overhauled the squad last summer forging a link up with Nottingham based football and education project Unity to form an Academy which appeared to be bearing some fruit as the first team, with several youngsters in it, were on the fringes of the play-off places.

Taking over in a caretaker capacity is former Eastwood Town goalkeeper Danny Bryant who was number two to Chambers and has managerial experience in his own right at Sutton Town. Bryant will be assisted by Pablo Grossett who is a well respected coach and motivator on the local Nottingham football scene. Grossett has been with Hucknall since November 2009.

### **HANSON SAGA CONCLUDED**

The long running saga revolving around the transfer of Guiseley striker James Hanson to Bradford City last summer was finally concluded on Thursday at a Football Association Tribunal held in Manchester. The decision was that Guiseley would receive a high four figure sum plus 25% of any money that Bradford City receive as a result of the player joining another club along with the proceeds of a pre-season friendly to be paid between the two clubs.

Guiseley Chairman Phil Rogerson said "Whilst it is not all that Guiseley had hoped for in compensation in developing James in to the player he is proving to be at Bradford City it is, nonetheless, an improvement on Bradford's final offer and at least the situation is now resolved amicably".

### **MARINE TURN TO HOLY SPIRITS**

Having already suffered five home league defeats and then the floodlights going out on them when they did appear to be on the way to three points against Whitby Town plus a home defeat in the FA Trophy by Kings Lynn who weeks later went out of business allied to three players sidelined with broken legs Marine manager Kevin Lynch has turned to God for help.

Convinced that not all is well at the Arriva Stadium Lynch, a parishioner at St Aloysius Church in Roby, asked Father Ealey from the church to bless the pitch in a bid to drive off the evil spirits that he believes have also contributed to the numerous occasions this season that his side have hit the woodwork. Fr Ealey blessed the pitch by conducting a short prayer before sprinkling holy water in the goalmouths and across the rest of the playing surface.

### **FC UNITED TO VISIT GERMANY**

Following their trip to South Korea last summer FC United of Manchester are to play fellow member owned German club St Pauli in May. FC United spokesperson Alison Watt said "Despite having a number of parallels this will be the first time the two clubs have met. Their fans are famous for creating an incredible atmosphere and take a strong standpoint against fascism, racism, sexism and homophobia. It is these principles that have led to St Pauli becoming a cult club worldwide and being asked to help mark their Centenary Year anniversary celebrations is a wonderful invitation. We are honoured that this friendly has been scheduled for the official date of their Centenary. Another away day has already been pencilled in for FC United fans with a visit to Irish League side Cliftonville in July.
