REVIEW OF THE WEEK

BOSTON UNITED are the new leaders of the top flight after winning 5-0 at OSSETT TOWN whose defence has suddenly sprung a leak having conceded seven the previous Saturday. The "Pilgrims" replace RETFORD UNITED whose home form is letting them down and they have won only one in ten on their own patch after KENDAL TOWN grabbed a point in stoppage time. BRADFORD PARK AVENUE moved in to the play-off places after beating FRICKLEY ATHLETIC (who are still looking for a first win on the road) to put themselves level on points with KINGS LYNN who were on FA Trophy duty and STOCKSBRIDGE PS who were held at home by WORKSOP TOWN. Elsewhere HUCKNALL TOWN beat third place ASHTON UNITED and BUXTON scored the only goal of the game at BURSCOUGH.

The match of the day in the First Division North between COLWYN BAY and LANCASTER CITY fell victim to the heavy rain that lashed the West coast all week and with both FC HALIFAX TOWN and LEIGH GENESIS on FA Trophy business that also left SKELMERSDALE UNITED without a game it meant only CURZON ASHTON of the top six were in action. Curzon, who have lodged an appeal against the five point penalty imposed on the club by the Football Association, appeared to have dropped two home points when TRAFFORD levelled in the 95th minute only for top scorer Michael Norton to then convert a 98th minute penalty and take the Tameside club to top spot on goal difference. LEIGH GENESIS, meanwhile, kept their unbeaten home record with a 5-1 midweek win over HARROGATE RAILWAY who are still to win on their travels. Harrogate tried again to break their duck on Saturday at BAMBER BRIDGE who, like Leigh, are unbeaten at home but failed to do so as "Brig" inflicted another four goal margin of defeat on Railway. At the bottom ROSSENDALE UNITED are another side still left searching for a first away win when, after taking the lead at GARFORTH TOWN, they went down 2-1 with their one goal still not enough to take them to double figures for the season. Just above Harrogate and Rossendale in the bottom two berths are WOODLEY SPORTS who have won only once in seventeen league outings after their latest home reverse at the hands of OSSETT ALBION. Continuing to climb the table are CLITHEROE, WARRINGTON TOWN and PRESCOT CABLES all of whom registered wins.

With WITTON ALBION on cup duty the top two SHEFFIELD and KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC both put three more points between themselves and the Cheshire side with victories against LINCOLN UNITED and BRIGG TOWN respectively. GLAPWELL also took advantage to climb to third with a 7-1 defeat of bottom club WILLENHALL TOWN with Lee Gregory being a greedy lad scoring six on his own and compounding things for Albion were CHASETOWN whose unbeaten home record seemed to have gone when they trailed GOOLE AFC 3-1 with five minutes left only to stage the come back of the day to win by the odd goal in seven! LEEK TOWN also left it late to preserve their unbeaten home record with a stoppage time leveller against RUSHALL OLYMPIC but another unbeaten side at home, BELPER TOWN, had no trouble in keeping their record intact with a 7-1 win against managerless LOUGHBOROUGH DYNAMO. Belper are the only team in the entire league to have scored in every game. There was a first away win of the season for CAMMELL LAIRD who squeezed home at next to bottom SPALDING UNITED whilst in the other two games there were wins for SHEPSHED DYNAMO and CARLTON TOWN.

The performance of the day in the FA Trophy was NANTWICH TOWN's 3-0 victory away at Eastwood Town whilst NORTH FERRIBY UNITED, AFC FYLDE and MOSSLEY all earned draws against Conference opposition. In the all UniBond games GUISELEY and KINGS LYNN pulled rank on FC HALIFAX TOWN and SALFORD CITY but WITTON ALBION held Premier Division MATLOCK TOWN.

TULIPS MANAGER RESIGNS

For the second time in five months Spalding United find themselves without a manager following the resignation of Mark Hone on Tuesday evening. Hone, a former Spalding player, was given the chance of his first step on the managerial ladder following the sudden departure of Alan Biley at the beginning of July and immediately found himself having to virtually build a side from scratch. He started with high hopes, drawing on his considerable experience of non-league football at the highest level, but results clearly have not gone his way.

That, however, is not the reason for which he has stepped down, instead citing pressures from a demanding day job for his departure. He said: "It came to a point where football began to take a greater part in my days and I could see it was affecting my work. I could not let that happen. My disappointment on leaving the football club is that I have not been able to lead them to a more secure position in the league". Taking charge of team affairs for the time being is Assistant Manager Richard Scott.

FOLWELL QUILTS AT LOUGHBOROUGH

Loughborough Dynamo manager John Folwell resigned his position immediately after last Saturday's 4-2 home defeat by promotion candidates Witton Albion which was the club's fourth defeat on the bounce. Folwell, who holds a UEFA "B" coaching badge, had been in charge for eighteen months having been Assistant to previous boss Adam Beazley. Club Chairman Frank Fall spent most of Sunday trying to persuade Folwell to change his mind without success.

Taking over team affairs until further notice are Coach John-Paul Considine and player Rick Nurse. Considine only joined Dynamo this season but has four years coaching experience previously and is also a qualified Sports Psychologist working at Leicester University for the past two years. Defender Nurse is now in his fourth season with Dynamo having joined from neighbours Quorn but has had limited opportunities on the playing front during the current campaign due to injury.

UNIBOND CLUBS TO PROVIDE WORLD CUP TRAINING VENUES

At least nine UniBond League grounds have been identified as possible training camp venues as part of the England 2018 World Cup bid. As part of the bid The FA are required to including training facilities in the venue areas identified to host matches and so far Bamber Bridge, Belper Town, Durham City, FC Halifax Town, Garforth Town, Grantham Town, Guiseley, Hucknall Town and Nantwich Town have been informed that their facilities may be utilised if the England bid is successful. Several other clubs have still to hear if they are also to be included in the list.

"It's exciting to think that World Cup stars could be training on our pitch," said Neville Clarke who has served on the Nantwich Town club committee for 50 years. "World Cup winner Roger Hunt played on our old ground at Jackson Avenue as a youngster with Stockton Heath but it would be amazing to have some of the best footballers in the world training at our new stadium."

LANCASTER DO THEIR BIT FOR ARMED FORCES

Lancaster City have done their bit to support the country's Armed Forces by announcing that in future all serving members of the armed forces will be admitted to home league games at the Giant Axe free of charge on production of their warrant card.

CARLTON'S YOUNGSTERS PUT ON HOLD

Carlton Town's bid to add another Football League scalp to the one they have already taken in this season's FA Youth Cup was put on hold in midweek when their tie at Stockport County was postponed on Wednesday due to a waterlogged pitch. They have already beaten League Two side Burton Albion after fighting their way through the qualifying rounds. Carlton could not have a better incentive for winning at Edgeley Park as the winners have been drawn to host Premier Division Fulham's youngsters in the Third Round.

PRESIDENT'S CUP

Six clubs this week won through to the quarter-final stage of the UniBond League President's Cup with last season's finalists Quorn amongst the casualties. They went down 3-1 at home to Grantham Town despite having led at half-time whilst FC Halifax Town and Skelmersdale United, like Grantham, also had to come from behind before being successful. Halifax trailed Mossley at home where they have a 100% record in the league but won 2-1 with the winner coming in stoppage time from leading scorer James Dean whilst things looked even bleaker for Skelmersdale United who were two goals down by the interval at home to Woodley Sports. "Skem" boss Tommy Lawton's two half time substitutions, however, came to the rescue with Mark Houghton and Ryan Wade scoring three of the five goals that saved Skem's blushes against a side that had won only one league game this season. The in-form Stamford won at Carlton Town whilst Curzon Ashton and Witton Albion both went in to the hat for the last eight at the expense of Garforth Town and Market Drayton Town respectively. In a delayed Second Round tie AFC Fylde had a comfortable 5-1 victory at Salford City and are now at home to Warrington Town for a place in the quarter finals whilst Belper Town and Chasetown are also still to meet after both clubs were involved in County Cup ties this week.

The draw for the next Round was made on Thursday and is as follows with the ties to be played Tuesday 8th December except the Curzon Ashton v Skelmersdale United tie which will take place on Monday 14th December due to Skem having a County Cup commitment on the 8th.

Andrew Connolly, owner of Rossendale United, has put the club up for sale. Mr Connolly said "It is the whole entity of Rossendale United that is up for sale. I am not selling for any other reason than it is good for the club. The debts have been cleared and it now needs someone with enthusiasm to get stuck in. I haven't been up to the club this season and it is only fair that I sell it but I want to make sure the right person takes over".

Club Chairman Steve Hobson who has run the club for the past two seasons added "We don't need rescuing because we are keeping our heads above water and we are bottom of the league because we have financial control which is better than having massive debts. Anybody investing will have to be interested in taking the club forward but will not be paying off huge old debts. My ideal scenario would be a group of businessmen who want to improve the club both on and off the field. We are a well respected club right at the heart of our community and held in high regard amongst many in non-league football".
