## **REVIEW OF THE WEEK**

Premier Division leaders RETFORD UNITED recorded only their second home win of the campaign when they beat early season front-runners ASHTON UNITED who have now lost five on the bounce. Retford's lead at the top was increased to four points when second place BOSTON UNITED went down at the in form MATLOCK TOWN who are now unbeaten in ten games. BRADFORD PARK AVENUE joined Boston on 36 points with a game in hand (and three on Retford) when they edged out NANTWICH TOWN 3-2 and after the top three its very tight indeed with just three points separating Ashton in fourth and NORTH FERRIBY UNITED in ninth. At the opposite end of the table spare a thought for bottom club DURHAM CITY who almost took their first point when losing 3-2 to FRICKLEY ATHLETIC for whom it was a first away success of the season and lifted them out of the relegation slots. Next to bottom OSSETT TOWN under new manager Peter Daniel surprised KENDAL TOWN to take their first point in five games with the Lake District side twice having to come from behind whilst Frickley were replaced in the bottom three by FC UNITED of MANCHESTER who drew at another relegation threatened club WHITBY TOWN. Elsewhere BUXTON and MARINE enjoyed home wins over HUCKNALL TOWN and STOCKSBRIDGE PS respectively.

First Division North leaders CURZON ASHTON lost their unbeaten home record when going down to WARRINGTON TOWN for whom Chris Gahgan scored both goals enabling COLWYN BAY to join them in top spot. The Welsh side went four up by half-time at GARFORTH TOWN before the home side struck twice late on to give the score line more respectability. LANCASTER CITY and SKELMERSDALE UNITED both won 3-1 to stay third and fourth whilst fifth placed FC HALIFAX TOWN lost ground with a 1-1 draw at LEIGH GENESIS who are unbeaten at home and will have been disappointed to have conceded a stoppage time equaliser. CLITHEROE had a fifth successive victory when they won at TRAFFORD and WOODLEY SPORTS also had a good week – after winning only once all season in the league they took six points in five days with wins over MOSSLEY and RADCLIFFE BOROUGH. Kris Dennis was their hero with four of the five goals including a hat-trick against Borough. ROSSENDALE UNITED lifted themselves off the bottom rung with a 2-1 win over AFC FYLDE to be replaced by HARROGATE RAILWAY who lost at home to CHORLEY. Still looking for a first home win are SALFORD CITY who lost to PRESCOT CABLES.

Having been knocked off top spot last weekend SHEFFIELD FC returned to the head of affairs in midweek with a 4-1 over SHEPshed DYNAMO but then lost their unbeaten home record in spectacular fashion when conceding six to BELPER TOWN at the weekend. That enabled KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC to move back in to pole position whilst GLAPWELL retained third with a win at CARLTON TOWN. Another unbeaten home record to crumble was CHASE TOWN's who lost to RUSHALL OLYMPIC enabling the latter to go fifth over WITTON ALBION who lost at Shepshed. At the bottom SPALDING UNITED seem to have made some good signings in the past fortnight and they enjoyed a 3-0 home win over LEEK TOWN but WILLENHALL TOWN's faithful are still goal starved and the bottom club have found the net just four times at home after losing 2-0 to BRIGG TOWN. Rounding off the week its two wins out of two for LOUGHBOROUGH DYNAMO'S new management team after a 2-0 win at GRANTHAM TOWN, there was a second away win of the season in the league for CAMMELL LAIRD who beat GOOLE AFC, a 2-0 win at LINCOLN UNITED kept newcomers MICKLEOVER SPORTS on the verge of the play-offs and QUORN drew at home to MARKET DRAYTON TOWN.

### **KINGS LYNN**

The League received confirmation at 5.00pm Wednesday 2nd December that Kings Lynn's application to have the winding up order which was placed on the club in the High Court the previous Wednesday 25th November had not been heard and is now scheduled for Wednesday 9th December.

After taking advice from the Football Association and following consultation with the Official Receiver's office Saturday's fixture North Ferriby United v Kings Lynn was postponed. The League will not be making any further statement until after the result of the application to be heard on 9th December is known.

### **OSSETT TOWN MANAGERIAL CHANGE**

Ossett Town are the latest club to undertake a managerial change with Paul Lines and Simon Milner stepping down after last Saturday's game to concentrate on building up the club's development centre. Taking over are Peter Daniel and Karl Leneghan with the former having racked up more than 400 appearances in the full time game including seven England Under 21 caps in 1977 whilst with Hull City. He also played for Wolves, Minnesota Strikers, Sunderland, Lincoln City and Burnley where he played in the Turf Moor side that was beaten by his former club in the 1988 Football League Cup Final at Wembley. He has previous managerial experience with several NCEL clubs. Leneghan was FC United of Manchester's goalkeeping coach until accepting the position as Daniel's Assistant.

### **SHEFFIELD FC TAKE POLE POSITION ON WORLD STAGE**

Sheffield FC may have been knocked off the top of the First Division South following last Saturday's defeat at Witton Albion but they took pole position on the world stage in midweek by claiming a prime spot on FIFA's stand at the Soccerex Conference held in Johannesburg during the run up to Friday's World Cup draw. Centre stage of the stand was a special plinth displaying football's original rule book from 1857 which was drawn up by Sheffield FC – the oldest football club in the world.

The historic South Yorkshire club, who already boast three FIFA executive committee men in Sepp Blatter, Jack Warner and Geoff Thompson as Life Members were hoping to add to that number this week by recruiting as many as possible of the 21 other members of FIFA's high command.

### **CARLTON YOUNGSTERS RAINED OFF AGAIN**

The UniBond League's last survivors in this season's FA Youth Cup Carlton Town were again rained off at Stockport County this week and, after two failed attempts to play the match at the Football League club whose first team match last weekend also fell foul of waterlogging, the tie has now been switched to Carlton next Monday 7<sup>th</sup> December. The winners face an attractive tie against Premiership club Fulham in the next round.

### **NANTWICH SIGN FORMER PREMIERSHIP STRIKER**

Nantwich Town have signed former Derby County striker Marvin Robinson who found the net in one of his few appearances in the top flight against Sunderland in 2001/2. All told he made over a century of appearances in the full time game having played for numerous clubs in a career blighted by injury. Andy Kinsey, another striker, also returns to the "Dabbers" after a spell with Congleton Town in the NWCL.

### **LEEK TOWN RELEASE DETAILS OF NEW SPORTS VILLAGE**

Details have been released this week of the proposed Staffordshire Moorlands District Council's Sports Village which will include improvements to Leek Town's Harrison Park home. The project, involving the District Council and Leek CSOB who play in the NWCL in addition to Leek Town FC, has been two years in planning and will eventually see Harrison Park upgraded with a new playing surface and perimeter fence.

### **UNIBOND "FAIR PLAY" AWARDS**

The UniBond "Fair Play" awards for November have gone to BOSTON UNITED, WARRINGTON TOWN and LINCOLN UNITED respectively. Both Boston and Warrington were winning the award for the second month in succession and only two clubs, Warrington and November runners-up AFC Fylde, have won the First Division North accolade this season. It was a different story in the First Division South where Lincoln became the fourth different club in as many months to scoop the prize. Boston are now well clear at the top of the Premier Division's season to date table with the £1,000 first prize beckoning them come next May. Warrington and AFC Fylde, having battled it out for the monthly award are also fighting it out in the season to date tables in the First Division North whilst Kidsgrove Athletic, joint runners up to Lincoln in November, have a healthy lead in the overall First Division South charts.
