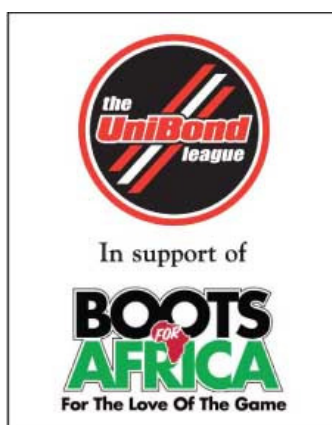

REVIEW OF THE WEEK

Just two games, both in the First Division North, beat the big weekend freeze with LEIGH GENESIS' under-soil heating at their state of the art stadium enabling them to bag three points against AFC FYLDE whilst WOODLEY SPORT'S artificial pitch also ensured play with the home side bagging a win against WAKEFIELD. In the one top flight match in midweek GUISELEY made headway towards the play-off spots after a 3-0 success over HUCKNALL TOWN with the table now showing the record of Kings Lynn expunged following the winding up order imposed on them by the High Court. . Also in midweek in the First Division North FC HALIFAX TOWN lost their 100% home record when held by WAKEFIELD on Tuesday and the same evening SALFORD CITY picked up their first home three pointer of the campaign with a 4-1 win against MOSSLEY. Another side to score four were LANCASTER CITY at home to ROSSENDALE UNITED and they moved in to top spot. Midweek results in the First Division South saw wins for GOOLE AFC, LEEK TOWN and CARLTON TOWN. Amongst the weekend postponements was GOOLE AFC for whom it was a first postponed game at home in six and half years whilst Premiership ref Alan Wiley did his bit for the non-league game making the inspection that saw CHASETOWN lose their home fixture.

UNIBOND LEAGUE LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE

The UniBond League has launched a new feature-rich website which hopes to set new standards in the non-league football community. Powered by the popular Pitchero sports network, the new league website includes a revamped design, improved layout and navigation. Utilising popular social networking features, the site allows clubs and supporters to upload and share their own video highlights and match photos creating an interactive online community of UniBond fans.

The UniBond League website currently attracts 150,000 unique visitors per month but league officials expect this to rise sharply with the launch of the new site. Pitchero, the *power* behind the new league website, has created a unique online community of non-league football and amateur rugby clubs spanning the full length of the UK. Many affiliated UniBond League clubs, including; Marine FC, Wakefield FC, Shepshed Dynamo FC and Belper Town FC, already use Pitchero to power their club websites. These clubs are set to benefit further from the Pitchero tie up because club content, such as match videos, team stats and match reports can be shared directly with the league website at the touch of a button, providing the league website with a daily stream of new UniBond content.

Being part of the hugely successful Pitchero sports network is a major bonus for the league and affiliated clubs at a time when clubs and leagues must fight for income and media space. Pitchero CEO, Mark Fletcher hopes this will be the first of many new league websites to be launched within the Pitchero network: He said "Creating a new website for the UniBond League has been a fantastic experience. We are excited by the ambition shown by the league committee and we look forward to working closely with the league and affiliated clubs in the future.

"Pitchero is fast becoming the number one online sports network for non-league football and we hope to welcome other leagues to the network very soon. Pitchero can provide a league or club with a bespoke platform to build a professional, feature-rich website. Every week, dozens of new clubs and thousands of new members join the Pitchero network helping to create the UK's biggest online amateur sports community."

"Over the years I have seen league websites evolve from just being a few pages showing news, match fixtures and results with some basic information on member clubs right through to the multimedia sites we have today. The UniBond League had a clear strategy of where it needed to be with regards to its official website but it was not until the approach from Pitchero that we could easily see the benefits of a partnership using their sports platform and how those benefits will take us to where we need to be"

PILGRIMS INVITE KINGS LYNN FANS TO FREE ENTRY

Following the demise of King's Lynn Football Club, Boston United have moved to offer free entry for King's Lynn season ticket holders to the Boxing Day fixture against Stocksbridge Park Steels. Reflecting on the offer, Boston chairman David Newton said "We were very sad to see King's Lynn go out of business and we really feel for their fans. "Boston United was days away from extinction a couple of seasons ago when we stepped in to make sure that the club survived for the town and the fans, so we have a lot of empathy with their situation.

"Over the past few days, we have been approached by a number of fans suggesting that we make this gesture and we thought it was a great idea. "I know how important the Boxing Day game is to our fans and it must be the same for the King's Lynn followers. Therefore any King's Lynn fans that wish to attend the game should take their season ticket passes to the ticket office at The Jakemans Stadium on the day where we will be happy to give them a complimentary ticket for the game. I realise it will not replace watching the team that was in their hearts but hopefully it will show that they are being thought about within the football family."

NANTWICH BOOST SQUAD WITH LOAN SIGNING

Nantwich head coach Peter Hall has added Port Vale midfielder Ross Davidson to his squad on an initial one month loan. The 20 year old is a product of the successful Port Vale youth team and made fifteen first team appearances (eight as substitute) last season.

AFC FYLDE FIND A NICKNAME.

When AFC Fylde changed its name from Kirkham and Wesham in May 2008 there was something missing – a club nickname. The club recently canvassed their supporters for nominations and held a ballot at AFC Fylde's home game against Garforth Town where the overwhelming majority of supporters voted "THE COASTERS" as the club's new official nickname. There were 3 options available, all of which were nominated by the Fylde fans, but THE COASTERS came out on top with the name synonymous with the club's slogan The Football Team of the Fylde Coast.

Peter Hardy, Chairman of the recently formed AFC Fylde Supporters club welcomes the name. " We are on the Fylde Coast and the vote for 'The Coasters' has proven popular with our supporters and the club. Every club needs a nickname and this is another development in the club's relatively short but successful history as it continues to build for the future. "

The club will now look at ways to incorporate this nickname into club correspondence, new ranges of club merchandise and come up with a club mascot. In the meantime club officials are hoping the supporters can come up with some club anthems and songs from the terraces with the new nickname in mind.
