REVIEW OF THE WEEK

There was very little by way of league action this week due to many clubs being involved in FA competitions and the League's own President's Cup. Premier Division leaders ASHTON UNITED, however, were left to rue a two goal advantage disappearing at home to WHITBY TOWN who fought back to grab a point on Monday. After claiming all three points at home for the first time this season only last Saturday BOSTON UNITED made it two on the bounce as they kept their third consecutive clean sheet when beating WORKSOP TOWN on Tuesday. The "Pilgrims" defence has now conceded just one goal in its last five league outings. RETFORD UNITED, meanwhile, moved in to the top four with a narrow success at next to bottom MATLOCK TOWN whilst STOCKSBRIDGE PS remain well on course for a century of goals this season after hitting another four at OSSETT TOWN. In the one other top tier game to take place MARINE leap frogged BURSCOUGH with a 2-1 victory.

There were just four games in the First Division North this week but they saw three of the top five in action with leaders COLWYN BAY dropping two points at home despite twice leading against fifth place TRAFFORD. That enabled CURZON ASHTON to close to within four points thanks to a Michael Norton hat-trick at WAKEFIELD. Although they took a point at PRESCOT CABLES with a late equaliser WOODLEY SPORTS are still searching for a first win on the road but OSSETT ALBION broke their duck on their travels when they won the bottom three clash at ROSSENDALE UNITED to lift themselves up to 17th place and above Woodley on goal difference.

The First Division South was the least active of the three Divisions with just three games but KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC's win at bottom club WILLENHALL TOWN in midweek saw them move up to fourth place only to be overtaken on Saturday when SHEFFIELD FC maintained their unbeaten home record with a win over MARKET DRAYTON TOWN to go top. Also keeping an unbeaten home record were MICKLEOVER SPORTS with a home success against BELPER TOWN.

In the FA Trophy First Qualifying Round the League were unbeaten in five games against outside opposition although both HUCKNALL TOWN and WITTON ALBION will have to try again after draws but BUXTON and First Division sides FC HALIFAX TOWN and LEIGH GENESIS all won. In the four all Premier Division ties not one home side was successful with FC UNITED of MANCHESTER, KINGS LYNN and NANTWICH TOWN all winning away whilst WORKSOP TOWN forced a draw. There were plenty of shocks in the eleven games where top tier sides took on First Division opposition with, in no particular order, CLITHEROE, BRIGG TOWN, LEEK TOWN, WILLENHALL TOWN, SALFORD CITY, and GLAPWELL all upsetting the odds. The five meetings between First Division North and South sides finished 2-1 in favour of the North with SKELMERSDALE UNITED and MOSSLEY registering wins for the North and SHEPSHED DYNAMO hitting back for the South with the other two games drawn.

SINNOTT RESIGNS AT AVENUE

Former Port Vale manager Lee Sinnott has quit as boss at Bradford Park Avenue following his side's FA Cup exit at home to Buxton on Monday evening. Taking over as caretaker is his Assistant John Deacey who actually managed the side last season whilst Sinnott, a former England Under 21 international in his playing career, was sorting out his contractual situation with Port Vale.

MARINE FC STATEMENT

Marine FC issued the following Press Statement this week after being notified of an FA decision to bring charges against four players associated with the club whose fixtures against Matlock Town and Witton Albion in April 2009 and March 2008 have been investigated by the game's governing body.

"Unibond Premier League Marine FC announces it has received notification from the Football Association that it has decided to charge four players with contravention of the FA's rules on betting. Three of the players Paul Woolcott, Adam Farley and Freddie Potter left Marine in the summer of 2009. Lee Parle had suffered a severe injury in October 2008 and had not played for a period of 7 months before the Matlock game being investigated and has only returned to playing football at the start of the current season. This follows an investigation by the FA Compliance Unit into unusual betting patterns on the Matlock Town v Marine league game played on Saturday 4th April 2009 in which Farley and Potter played and the Marine v Witton Albion league game played on Friday 21st March 2008 in which none of the four players played.

Marine Chairman Paul Leary said "The officers of Marine Football Club have to date co-operated fully with the staff of the Football Association who have been conducting the investigation with the individuals concerned into the allegations made. I will continue, with the officers of Marine, to co-operate fully with the next stage of their disciplinary process and shall provide any information that will help them to conclude matters as soon as possible. Marine Football Club shall not issue any further statements until the matter is closed"

STAMFORD LOSE SCARFF

Stamford AFC have lost the services of assistant manager Kieran Scarff who has accepted the post of Centre of Excellence manager with neighbouring Championship club Peterborough United. Scarff, a former "Daniels" player, only rejoined the club as Tuncay Korkmaz's right hand man in May.

The vacancy has been filled from within by the promotion of player-coach Ben Sedgemore to the role. The 34 year old was capped by England at schoolboy level and started his career in the professional game with Birmingham City. After making his Football League debut on loan to Northampton Town he had spells with Peterborough United, Mansfield Town, Macclesfield Town and Lincoln City. In his professional career he made 343 appearances in league and cup football scoring 20 goals.

Since leaving the Football League in 2004 Sedgemore has seen service with Canvey Island, Cambridge United, Rushden & Diamonds, Havant & Waterlooville, Chelmsford City, Kings Lynn and Boston United. In addition, he is currently a member of the management committee of the Professional Footballers' Association.

PRESIDENT'S CUP

Last season's beaten President's Cup finalists Quorn progressed to the last sixteen of this campaign's competition with a 3-0 win over Spalding United on Tuesday evening. The draw for the next Round will be made on Sunday, 25th October at the Board Meeting scheduled to take place that day with ties to be played midweek commencing 16th November.

FIVE THROUGH

The UniBond League has five clubs definitely through to the final Qualifying Round of this year's FA Cup with a possible sixth on the horizon if SALFORD CITY can continue their heroics with a win at famed FA Cup giantkillers Blyth Spartans next Tuesday evening after twice coming from behind to earn a replay last Tuesday in the delayed 3rd Qualifying Round meeting. They haven't lost in three games now against Conference North opposition and will be desperately hoping that run continues when they travel to the North East with their reward if successful being a home tie against AFC Telford United.

FC UNITED of MANCHESTER pulled off a superb 1-0 victory over another Conference North club Stalybridge Celtic after drawing with them 3-3 last Sunday. Almost 5,000 watched the two games and United now go to Northwich Victoria in what will be the fledgling club's first ever appearance at this stage. Another team also on their travels are KENDAL TOWN who go to Nuneaton Town after beating fellow Premier Division side Guiseley in Tuesday's replay but the other three survivors are all drawn at home. After beating Bradford Park Avenue in a replay on Monday BUXTON will be at home to Stourbridge, conquerors of Hucknall Town in midweek whilst the two surviving First Division clubs both have attractive home draws against former Football League clubs. FC HALIFAX TOWN will meet Wrexham who went out of last season's competition to UniBond opposition whilst LINCOLN UNITED's prize for overcoming Premier Division Frickley Athletic in a penalty shoot out is a home game against Cambridge United.

The Lincoln United tie, which is the club's first ever home game at this stage of the competition, has been switched to Sunday, 25th October after discussions with the local Police. The remaining ties will be played on Saturday, 24th October.

CHARITY RAISING DUO MEET SIR TOM

An FA Cup charity fundraising duo met a football legend at the latest game of their mammoth tour. Brothers Richard Knowles, from Frodsham, and Robert, from Southport met Sir Tom Finney as their 'Runcorn2wembley' campaign reached its fifth round (FA Cup third qualifying round) last Saturday (10th October 2009).

They and Sir Tom watched UniBond League rivals Guiseley clash with Kendal Town in the third qualifying round as Sir Tom was at the game in his capacity as President of Kendal Town.

'Runcorn2wembley' is following the FA Cup from the very first round right through to the final, raising money for Cancer Research in the process. The football fanatics are hoping to raise over £5,000 for charity as they follow the winning team in each round.

They collected over £200 on the day from UniBond supporters to take the overall total to over £1,100. Richard (35) dreamed up the idea with Robert (34) in 2005, but has only now put his idea into reality although the original plans never included an introduction to a football legend such as Sir Tom Finney!

CONTRACT FOR CARLTON TOWN YOUNGSTER

Young Carlton Town wide man Anthony Griffith has been handed a contract by the club after some excellent early season performances that have attracted interest from several other clubs. Manager Tommy Brookbanks said "We have been in talks with Anthony about a contract for several weeks and he finally put pen to paper to bring speculation about his future to an end for now."

"We have ambitions ourselves and don't want to lose our best players but at the same time I believe Anthony can go on and play at the very highest level" added the Carlton Town manager.

ROBERTS RETURNS TO MARKET DRAYTON

Market Drayton Town, who lost manager Simon Line to Hednesford Town last week, have turned to Line's mentor Lee Roberts as his replacement. Roberts, who played over 150 games for Exeter City including their memorable FA Cup victory over Newcastle United in which he scored Exeter's goal in a drawn first game, helped launch Market Drayton from the ashes of the old Little Drayton Rangers seven years ago. He brought in Line as his Assistant Manager and handed the reins over him completely two years later giving Line his first crack at management.

In the two games since Line's departure Market Drayton have suffered two 4-0 defeats going in to today's league fixture at Sheffield FC. Stand in managers Steve McCormick and Mick Murphy return to their previous roles under Line as Assistant and Coach respectively with Roberts.
