There was a new leader at the top of the Premier Division after previous top dogs ASHTON UNITED slumped to a 4-0 defeat at NORTH FERRIBY UNITED leaving BOSTON UNITED to take over at the head of affairs when they broke NANTWICH TOWN's unbeaten home record with equally emphatic 4-0 score line. For a team in second place Ashton have a very unusual goal difference in the minus bracket! Nantwich's reverse saw them drop from second to fifth with both KINGS LYNN and RETFORD UNITED overtaking them on goal difference although neither won. The Norfolk side drew at MARINE whilst Retford's poor home form continued with a draw against OSSETT TOWN that leaves the "Badgers" with one home success in six attempts. DURHAM CITY almost made their first league point of the campaign but lost 3-2 against GUISELEY who are two points adrift of the play-off spots along with STOCKSBRIDGE PS who went down at home to BRADFORD PARK AVENUE. There is then a cluster of five clubs, NORTH FERRIBY UNITED, KENDAL TOWN, BURSCOUGH, HUCKNALL TOWN and MARINE all on twenty points and a further four, including FRICKLEY ATHLETIC who hit four at home against HUCKNALL TOWN, all on eighteen points. Next to bottom MATLOCK TOWN failed to close the three point gap between themselves and 18th placed opponents WHITBY TOWN with a 2-2 draw after leading with ten minutes left.

COLWYN BAY increased their lead at the top of the First Division North to five points over FC HALIFAX TOWN with a solitary goal at home to BAMBER BRIDGE whilst the Yorkshire club, who were on FA Cup duty at the weekend, moved up a place from the previous week beating HARROGATE RAILWAY ATHLETIC on Monday. LANCASTER CITY joined CURZON ASHTON on 27 points with a win at GARFORTH TOWN whilst Curzon were being held at AFC FYLDE. SKELMERSDALE UNITED complete the play-off places after a fine week in which they hit eight goals four of which came on Tuesday at WARRINGTON TOWN and they repeated the feat on Saturday to beat TRAFFORD. In sixth are LEIGH GENESIS whose 100% home record was dented by MOSSLEY in a 1-1 draw. PRESCOT CABLES home form keeps them away from the drop zone and they were on the button again with a 1-0 win over CHORLEY whilst SALFORD CITY moved off the bottom for the first time with a fine 4-2 success at OSSETT ALBION that keeps the Yorkshire side looking uncomfortably over their shoulder. Falling in to bottom spot are ROSSENDALE UNITED who lost at home to WARRINGTON TOWN and they are a point behind HARROGATE RAILWAY ATHLETIC who are still looking for a first win on their travels after drawing 1-1 with WOODLEY SPORTS. It was a frustrating week for Woodley who were denied all three points at BAMBER BRIDGE on Tuesday with two goals in the last ten minutes and again on Saturday when Harrogate netted the equaliser in the sixth minute of added time.

The First Division South has new leaders with KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC the latest to sit at the summit after wins over LOUGHBOROUGH DYNAMO and BELPER TOWN. They are locked on 27 points with RUSHALL OLYMPIC who couldn't break BRIGG TOWN's unbeaten home record on Saturday after hitting four at home in midweek against CARLTON TOWN and also on 27 points are SHEFFIELD FC who won at struggling SPALDING UNITED. Whilst MICKLEOVER SPORTS maintained their unbeaten home record on Wednesday with a comfortable victory over Spalding they couldn't register their first away win when held at GLAPWELL whilst CAMELL LAIRD and STAMFORD are other sides struggling on the road without an away win after losing at SHEPSHED DYNAMO and MARKET DRAYTON TOWN respectively. In contrast GRANTHAM TOWN remain the only side unbeaten away from home and kept that tag with a late winner against bottom club WILLENHALL TOWN.

By any stretch of the imagination it was bad day at the office for UniBond sides in the FA Cup as all four sides on duty went out without scoring a goal between them. FC HALIFAX TOWN and KENDAL TON came closest to forcing replays but went down to very late goals whilst BUXTON lost 0-4 at home to Stourbridge who they meet again next week in the FA Trophy and FC UNITED of MANCHESTER lost at Northwich Victoria 3-0. UniBond hopes now rest solely on First Division South club LINCOLN UNITED who, without a home win in the League all season, host former Football League club Cambridge United tomorrow (Sunday).

BUXTON BEAT THE STATS IN FA TROPHY DRAW

The draw for the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Trophy sent Stourbridge to BUXTON for the second successive Saturday in FA competitions following the meeting of the two clubs in today's FA Cup 4th Qualifying Round tie where the UniBond League side were attempting to reach the First Round Proper for the first time in 47 years. It was also Buxton's eleventh successive home draw in FA competitions since the start of last season – seven in the FA Cup and four in the Trophy – with the odds against that sequence apparently being 2048-1 against! Keeper Scott Hartley has certainly played his part in this season's cup runs saving four of five penalties he has faced.

Elsewhere midweek replay wins for QUORN and LANCASTER CITY brought potentially lucrative ties for them. Quorn's reward for fighting back from a 3-1 interval deficit against Radcliffe Borough to win 6-3 is a trip to former Football League club BOSTON UNITED whilst LANCASTER CITY made the long midweek trip to Chasetown worthwhile with a 4-1 win that sees them drawn at home to FC UNITED of MANCHESTER. There are two all Premier Division ties with FRICKLEY ATHLETIC at home to GUISELEY and KINGS LYNN travelling to WHITBY TOWN. The top tier sides face First Division opposition in just two ties NANTWICH TOWN at home to LEEK TOWN whilst NORTH FERRIBY UNITED will travel to CARLTON TOWN after eventually overcoming Worksop Town in Wednesday night's replay 5-4 on penalties after a 4-4 draw.

Two ties see the First Division North take on their South counterparts with AFC FYLDE at home to GLAPWELL whilst the North's form side FC HALIFAX TOWN go to SHEPSHED DYNAMO. There are two all First Division North ties at LEIGH GENESIS and SALFORD CITY where SKELMERSDALE UNITED and CLITHEROE are the respective visitors whilst WITTON ALBION host BRIGG TOWN in the one all First Division South meeting. Besides Buxton, three other clubs meet outside opposition with MATLOCK TOWN and MOSSLEY both on their travels to Brackley Town and Cambridge City respectively with WILLENHALL TOWN at home to Nuneaton Town who have been the scourge of UniBond clubs this season. Ties to be played next Saturday.

CARLTON TOWN FLY THE FLAG FOR UNIBOND LEAGUE IN FA YOUTH CUP

Carlton Town are now the sole UniBond League survivors in this season's FA Youth Cup after the League's other two remaining representatives Loughborough Dynamo and Mickleover Sports bowed out in midweek defeats. Carlton convincingly beat Solihull Moors 5-1 to take their place in the First Round Proper, the stage at which Football League clubs enter, and have been rewarded for their endeavours with a home game against Burton Albion with the tie expected to be played on 5th November when the Carlton youngsters will be hoping to provide some fireworks of their own.

It looked at the thirty minute mark of Mickleover's home tie against Malvern that the UniBond League would have another name in the hat for the First Round Proper draw as the UniBond side led 3-1. A bad injury, however, to a Malvern player held up play for forty minutes and when the sides returned to the pitch Mickleover couldn't regain their control and lost 4-3. Loughborough went down 3-1 to Mansfield Town in the other tie.

GUISELEY IN WRANGLE OVER HANSON

Guiseley are still embroiled in trying to settle a fee for their former striker James Hanson whom they transferred to Bradford City in the summer and it seems the dispute over the fee could result in the matter being referred to a transfer tribunal. If that happened it is believed it will be the first time a Football League club has been taken to independent arbitration over a fee by a semi-pro club. Hanson has scored four times in his debut season for the "Bantams".

LEEK SIGN PROLIFIC GRICE

Leek Town manager Wayne Johnson this week completed the signing of Mark Grice from First Division South colleagues Market Drayton Town. The 25 year old was a prolific goal scorer at lower levels of the game finding the back of the net 150 times in three seasons at Wolstanton United. He has also played at Newcastle Town and Nantwich Town.

Former England youth international goalkeeper Steve Hodgson, now 27, clocked up his hundredth appearance for the club against Goole recently having begun his career at Manchester City.

BALLS OF STEEL FOR SHEFFIELD FC GUESTS

Guests at Sheffield FC's 152nd annual dinner this week had the chance to get their hands on a unique piece of 'future' city memorabilia with an auction for ten of a limited edition of 50 miniature stainless steel footballs that are being created by Sheffield cutting tool manufacturer Dormer Tools.

The artefacts are a symbol for what Sheffield FC chairman Richard Tims, along with Sheffield MP Richard Caborn, hopes will become reality in the shape of a giant sculpture near the M1. Both are looking to create a large eight metre high stainless steel football close to where the Tinsley Towers used to be – bringing together two exports Sheffield has given to the world – and providing a special piece of art as the gateway to the city.

Richard Tims said: "We agreed the annual dinner would be a perfect way to inform people of our plans to create a giant stainless steel football to mark the heritage of the city. This could be something really remarkable and provide a new symbol for Sheffield to be proud of whilst at the same time showcasing to the rest of the country what this great city has given to the world by way of the oldest football club and the steel industry. By having the smaller versions we hope to attract more people to back the project as well as offering a unique way of raising money for both the club and funding for the project."

FC UNITED SIGN INTERNATIONAL

FC United of Manchester are Ludovic Quistin's latest port of call in a long list of semi-professional clubs that the 25 year old Guadeloupe international, who recently relocated to the North West, has signed for. Quistin made his international bow against Haiti in June 2007 and was part of the Guadeloupe side that beat Cuba on penalties to reach the 2009 CONCACAF Gold Cup Finals. He has won nine caps to date and is a cousin of French international William Gallas.

FORMER FOREST PLAYER SIGNS FOR BOSTON

Former Nottingham Forest striker Spencer Weir-Daley has signed for Boston United following his release by Ilkeston Town. The 24 year old scored twice in eleven appearances for Forest including a goal on his Football League debut against Gillingham in August 2005. He signed a two year contract for Notts County in 2007 and played around fifty games for them making over eighty appearances in his full time career including loan spells with Macclesfield Town, Lincoln City and Bradford City.
