## REVIEW OF THE WEEK

RETFORD UNITED went back to the head of affairs in the top flight when their excellent away record again came up trumps at STOCKSBRIDGE PS to move them a point ahead of BOSTON UNITED who let two points slip in the dying minutes of their home game against BURSCOUGH who had twice led in a 3-3 draw. BRADFORD PARK AVENUE move up two places to third with a solitary goal win at NANTWICH TOWN that dropped ASHTON UNITED to fourth after they lost at home to NORTH FERRIBY UNITED. In the other two Premier Division games to survive the weather WHITBY TOWN jumped five places with a 4-0 victory at WORKSOP TOWN whilst bottom club DURHAM CITY went past the century of goals conceded before the half way stage of the campaign with a 7-1 loss at HUCKNALL TOWN.

CURZON ASHTON moved three points clear at the top of the First Division North with a 5-2 win at CHORLEY who had also failed to win at home in midweek when held by PRESCOT CABLES. Curzon had been level on points with COLWYN BAY before play began but the Welsh side went down to LEIGH GENESIS who are unbeaten at home and who cemented their sixth place with a 3-1 win. Third, fourth and fifth place clubs LANCASTER CITY, SKELMERSDALE UNITED and FC HALIFAX TOWN all won with the same 2-1 scoreline. Halifax were maintaining a 100% home record against lowly WOODLEY SPORTS whilst "Skem" struggled to shake off bottom club ROSSENDALE UNITED who are still searching for a first win on the road as are HARROGATE RAILWAY ATHLETIC who crashed 6-0 at WAKEFIELD. After a slow start CLITHEROE are in a purple patch and continued their winning ways to go level on points in joint seventh with latest victims BAMBER BRIDGE whilst TRAFFORD moved up to ninth with a win at WARRINGTON TOWN.

The leadership of the first Division South also changed hands again with KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC returning to the top after beating MARKET DRAYTON TOWN whilst SHEFFIELD FC were losing the Division's big match of the day at WITTON ALBION. The Cheshire side, however, failed to make any headway from fifth place as both GLAPWELL and CHASETOWN won with the latter doing particularly well to win at STAMFORD who have been in good form of late. BELPER TOWN, LEEK TOWN and MICKLEOVER SPORTS were all defending unbeaten home records and all three were successful although Leek needed a last gasp leveller against SHEPSHED DYNAMO. Belper also drew against GOOLE AFC despite twice leading but Mickleover were more convincing with 4-1 victory over GRANTHAM TOWN. Back to winning ways were RUSHALL OLYMPIC with a narrow success against QUORN who haven't won on their travels and another team to struggle away, SPALDING UNITED, were also left still searching for that elusive first away win despite taking their "goals for" column from one to four at LOUGHBOROUGH DYNAMO. The home team, however, who had lost five on the bounce had more ammunition than the "Tulips" and won 5-3. The one other game saw CARLTON TOWN win 4-2 at BRIGG TOWN.

## **MORE MANAGERIAL CHANGES**

**WOODLEY** manager Trevor McFarlane stepped down from his position immediately following last Saturday's home defeat against Ossett Albion that left his side with just one league win in seventeen attempts – a figure that would have been much improved had matches been played over eighty minutes rather than ninety such have been the late goals that the Cheshire side have conceded this season.

McFarlane took up his position on Boxing Day 2008 after a successful period managing both the Youth team and Reserves and after a strong run by the first team under his guidance he had his position as first team manager made permanent in March. He is taking a few weeks out before returning to the club to discuss other roles.

Woodley are now advertising the position with interested parties requested to send their CV's by e-mail only to woodleysportsfc@btinternet.com Until an appointment is made team affairs will be looked after by club officials with Chairman Tony Whiteside saying "Although the ethos of the club in promoting young players through its three teams remains intact it is felt that a change is needed by bringing in some experience to take the first team to the next level".

The second manager to resign in the week came after **WILLENHALL TOWN's** 7-1 home defeat at the hands of Glapwell last Saturday after which it was announced that manager Shaun Cunnington and his Assistant Paul Tomlinson would be leaving the club. The club's committee stressed they had been delighted that the managerial pair had produced a side capable of competing at UniBond level despite having no playing budget to work with. The move came as the club feels it needs to look at rebuilding its finances for the future.

Taking over the running of the first team are Steve Pomroy and Micky Rawlins who will have a tough UniBond League debut as they will be working with very scarce resources. Neither of them have been involved in management at this level with Pomroy having started his playing career as an apprentice with Shrewsbury Town before moving on to Walsall and then into the non-league game with Nuneaton, Dudley Town, Stourbridge and Willenhall. Rawlins, whose playing career encompassed Darlaston, Willenhall, Bilston and Hednesford as well as captaining an FA representative team has managed Willenhall previously in a caretaker capacity and has also coached in the USA.

**LOUGHBOROUGH DYNAMO**, meanwhile, announced their new managerial team to replace John Folwell who stepped down earlier in the month. Although currently injured Scott Clamp becomes player-manager and he has asked Ian Blyth to join him as joint manager. Clamp, who is likely to be sidelined for a good while with a serious knee injury, only joined Dynamo this season having played previously with Bedworth, Nuneaton Borough, Sutton Coldfield, Barwell, Hinckley, Chasetown and Atherstone. Blyth began his playing career at Leicester City before moving on to Bedworth, Corby Town and Hinckley. He has been both Assistant Manager and Manager in his own right for a number of years at Barwell until leaving at the end of the 2007/8 season.

Then it was the turn of **MARKET DRAYTON TOWN** who are now in to their fourth manager of the season (five if you count regular stand in caretaker Mick Murphy) with third incumbent Matthew Burton departing after only a fortnight. Long serving 'keeper Andy Pryce who has played almost 300 games for the club and is in his seventh season at Greenfields is the latest to fill the hot seat vacated already by Simon Line, Lee Roberts and Burton. In fact it has been an eventful week at the club with Chairman Alex Mutch also standing down and Julian Parton taking his place. Another Chairman to resign this week was **DURHAM CITY's** Stewart Dawson who is replaced by Ian Walker as the club undergo a major overhaul of their background personnel.

## **KINGS LYNN WOUND UP IN HIGH COURT**

Kings Lynn FC was wound up on Wednesday in the High Court and the club's fixture against Guiseley scheduled for today did not go ahead. It is understood that the club intends to return to the High Court within seven days of the winding up order being served in an attempt to have the decision rescinded. The League will not be making any further statement until the outcome of the club's application to the High Court is known.

## **OBITUARY**

Rossendale United were this week in mourning for Billy Greenan who died suddenly at the age of 62. He was an integral part of one of Rossendale's best ever sides when from the mid to late eighties he was Assistant Manager to Steve Conaghan and was one of the true characters of the non-league scene of that era. His funeral was held on Friday.

### **TASTY FA TROPHY DRAW**

Following the midweek replays the UniBond League will have four survivors competing for a place in the last 32 of this season's FA although that could be reduced to three should Kings Lynn not be successful in having their winding up order rescinded in the High Court. The one 3<sup>rd</sup> Qualifying Round tie still to be decided between Matlock Town and Witton Albion has taken on added significance with the winners drawn at home to former Football League club and four times FA Trophy finalists Kidderminster Harriers. The other survivors all face Conference North opposition with NANTWICH TOWN hosting Stalybridge Celtic after the latter put out AFC Telford United in a midweek replay whilst GUISELEY are also at home with Redditch United the visitors on Saturday, 12<sup>th</sup> December. Should KINGS LYNN manage to have their winding up order rescinded they will travel to Vauxhall Motors.

AFC FYLDE, meanwhile, missed out on a great home tie against York City when they lost their midweek replay 7-3 at Hinckley United after they pushed forward looking for an equaliser when 4-3 down and their First Division North counterparts MOSSLEY also lost against Conference North opposition when they went down 2-0 in the face of a gale force wind and lashing rain against Ilkeston Town. NORTH FERRIBY UNITED took Gainsborough Trinity to extra-time and penalties before losing out.

### **TANDY STAYS PUT**

Witton Albion manager Gary Finley has secured the services of former Manchester City player Jamie Tandy after the 25 year old signed a contract following some impressive displays. The left sided midfielder originally joined Albion as a non-contract player in August and the Wincham Park faithful took an instant liking to Tandy's style of play and commitment and will be hoping he can help them bounce straight back in to the UniBond Premier Division at the first time of asking following their relegation last May.

### **LOW TURN OVER AT BUXTON**

Buxton players have shown remarkable loyalty to the club with well over half the squad now in the three figure bracket for appearances. Player-coach Scott Maxfield along with defenders Gregg Anderson and Grant Black all reached the century mark in the club's last three matches whilst midfielder Michael Towe made it past the 200 mark to join Tommy Agus and Scott Hartley and striker Mark Reed who has netted 144 goals in 240 appearances.

### **UNIBOND "CLUB OF THE MONTH" AWARDS**

The Unibond "Club of the Month" awards have gone to MATLOCK TOWN, CURZON ASHTON and GLAPWELL respectively. Matlock have been on a good run lately to be unbeaten in their last eight games four of which were in November. They won all three league games they contested in the month and drew an FA Trophy tie. Their nearest challengers were Derbyshire neighbours Buxton who had four wins and one defeat. The two First Division awards were clear cut with Curzon and Glapwell both able to boast 100% records during November.
