REVIEW OF THE HOLIDAY PERIOD

Just five games survived the snow and frost on Boxing Day and the clubs who hastily tried to re-arrange for Monday also failed to get a game on. Where play was possible in the Premier Division BOSTON UNITED appeared to be cruising to three points against STOCKSBRIDGE PS but a late surge from the "Steels" left the former Football League side hanging on to secure the points at 3-2. In the one other top flight match NANTWICH TOWN enjoyed only their second win on the road when beating MARINE. The First Division North was completely wiped out but in the South section newcomers MICKLEOVER SPORTS maintained their unbeaten home record with a narrow win over another newly promoted side MARKET DRAYTON TOWN. Elsewhere GRANTHAM TOWN had a rare home victory when they beat LINCOLN UNITED with the only goal of the game and whilst QUORN will have been happy to grab a point with a stoppage time equaliser in a 3-3 draw at LOUGHBOROUGH DYNAMO they still entered the New Year without an away win this term.

New Year's Day proved to be even worse than Boxing Day with only four fixtures surviving. The one game in the Premier Division to beat the frost saw NANTWICH TOWN come from behind to beat MATLOCK TOWN and make it a holiday double whilst the sole surviving First Division South game resulted in a home defeat for SPALDING UNITED with GRANTHAM TOWN's Ian Robinson scoring the only goal of the game as his side also registered a festive season double. There was a major upset in the First Division North where RADCLIFFE BOROUGH enjoyed their trip to the seaside putting four past joint leaders COLWYN BAY to record only their second away league win of the campaign. The Welsh side's defeat enabled LANCASTER CITY to go three points clear when they extended their winning sequence to eight after coming from a goal down to win 3-1 at home to BAMBER BRIDGE.

UNIBOND “CLUB OF THE MONTH” AWARDS

The UniBond League “Club of the Month” awards for December have gone to NORTH FERRIBY UNITED, LANCASTER CITY and newcomers MICKLEOVER SPORTS with all three winners able to boast 100% records in the month.

Ferriby, are possibly the first side to pick up the Premier Division accolade without having played a home game in the month having beaten Hucknall Town and Guiseley in the league and Frickley Athletic in the League Challenge Cup to become the fifth different winners of the prize in as many months and move quietly in to the play-off zone. Bradford Park Avenue also had a 100% record in their three games but one was a County Cup tie against lower ranking outside opposition.

Lancaster City’s victories over Rossendale United, Skelmersdale United and Wakefield in December made it seven wins on the bounce and enabled the Giant Axe club to end the decade at the head of affairs in the First Division North.

Newly promoted Mickleover are obviously enjoying life in their new surroundings and home wins over Market Drayton Town and Shepshed Dynamo allied to successes on their travels to Lincoln United and Carlton Town saw them rise to third place with an unbeaten home record in the First Division South.

UNIBOND “FAIR PLAY” AWARDS

LANCASTER CITY and MICKLEOVER SPORTS doubled up their December “Club of the Month” successes by also scooping the monthly Fair Play awards in their respective Divisions. For Mickleover, who received just two cautions in their four games, it was a second Fair Play award in three months and took them to the top of the First Division South season to date table just ahead of Kidsgrove Athletic.

Lancaster, meanwhile, retained third place in the First Division North season to date table and closed the gap on second place Warrington Town. Leaders AFC Fylde suffered their first dismissal since joining the UniBond League but still enjoy a very healthy lead and they are the only one of the 64 member clubs averaging less than one caution per game.

As only one club, Marine, played the normal minimum requirement of four games in the Premier Division during December due to the bad weather this requirement had to be dropped to three matches with ASHTON UNITED taking the spoils. Boston United, winners of this award for the past two months, blotted their copy book with nine cautions and a dismissal but still enjoy a comfortable lead in the season to date tables.

Each of the three Divisional overall season winners will receive a cheque for £1,000 courtesy of League sponsors UniBond with the runners-up in each Division pocketing £650 and the third place clubs £350. The season to date tables can be found elsewhere in this Press Release.

“Fair Play” took on a new meaning with Ashton’s award as Club Chairman David Aspinall said the 1.5 litre bottle of Famous Grouse whisky prize will be offered to the family of former Ashton United player Matt Edgington who is still seriously ill after being the victim of an unprovoked attack in Manchester at the beginning of December. Aspinall said “I have spoken to manager Danny Johnson and on behalf of the players the whisky will be donated to Matt’s family and used to raise funds either for Matt’s rehabilitation or as a fund raiser for the ward where he has received so much care.” The 25 year old, who has played for several UniBond clubs including Rossendale, Radcliffe and Clitheroe in addition to Ashton, is understood to be showing some signs of recovery after being in a coma and intensive care following the attack.

AFC FYLDE O'HANLON COUP

UniBond League newcomers AFC Fylde made a very impressive appointment this week with the news that former Republic of Ireland international Kelham O'Hanlon has been made manager taking over from Mick Fuller who will now concentrate on other roles within the club. As well as racking up around five hundred appearances in the full time game with Middlesbrough, Rotherham United, Carlisle United, Preston North End and Dundee United O'Hanlon has considerable management and coaching experience in the Football League.

He was assistant manager to David Moyes at Preston North End but turned down the chance of following Moyes to Everton in 2002 to take over as caretaker boss at Deepdale. He left Preston in 2003 due to cost cutting and suffered the same fate in 2005 at Bury where he had been coaching. He then became coach at Barnsley (during which time the club reached the semi-final of the FA Cup) until September 2009 when manager Simon Davey was replaced by the South Yorkshire club. As well as winning one full cap in which he kept a clean sheet as the Republic of Ireland beat Israel 5-0 O'Hanlon also won two Under 21 caps.

Club President David Haythornthwaite said "We are absolutely delighted to secure Kelham's services. He is a first class person who I have known for over ten years. Although still relatively young, he has a vast experience in the football world which can only be beneficial to the club. Although some may consider this a backward move for Kelham, we persuaded him that this was a great place to kick start his own managerial career as he is fully aware of our ambitious plans for the future and wants to be part of it".

Commenting on Mick Fuller's position Mr Haythornthwaite said " We are very grateful for Mick's contribution over the last fifteen years as he has been instrumental in our success and helped us achieve our current position. I am sure he will be able to help Kelham through the transition period while taking on a different role with the club."

ASHTON NAME TALBOT AS ASSISTANT

Ashton United manager Danny Johnson has named former Ashton player Robbie Talbot as his new assistant to replace the recently departed Danny Jones. Talbot was a free scoring forward on the semi-pro scene for whom Morecambe paid £10,000 to Burscough in 2001 for his services recouping £7,000 of that when selling him to Burton Albion two years later. Johnson said "Robbie's specialism was sticking the ball in the back of the net and I can see him spending quite a bit of time on the training ground with our strikers. He is an excellent coach with a great understanding for the game at this level and above. It is a great appointment for Ashton United".

GRUNDY BECOMES THIRD NUMBER ONE AT WITTON

Former Bury goalkeeper Aaron Grundy, who is just a month short of his 22nd birthday, becomes the third number one signed by Witton Albion manager Gary Finley in a relative short space of time. Grundy, who made a handful of first team appearances for Bury after graduating through their Academy, will replace Joe Clegg who recently announced he was giving up football to concentrate on a professional career in bodybuilding.
