REVIEW OF THE WEEK

When action got underway again following a virtual six week break due to the weather there was little change at the top of the Premier Division where all the top four won. Leaders RETFORD UNITED edged out MARINE to keep their three point lead intact whilst BOSTON UNITED hit double figures against beleaguered DURHAM CITY although there was the unusual sight in this match of a team ten goals to the good having a player sent off in the 90th minute! Third place BRADFORD PARK AVENUE kept their unbeaten away record with three points at MATLOCK TOWN with NORTH FERRIBY UNITED not to be outdone hitting five at home against FRICKLEY ATHLETIC. Dropping out of the play-off spots were HUCKNALL TOWN who lost at WHITBY TOWN to be replaced by ASHTON UNITED who got their hopes back on track after a long lean spell with a win at next to bottom OSSETT TOWN and GUISELEY kept up the pressure on the top six with victory at WORKSOP TOWN. After losing in the League Cup during midweek to KENDAL TOWN a hat-trick for Gary McEvatt gave BURSCOUGH sweet revenge in the league fixture despite being reduced to ten men whilst elsewhere the biggest crowd of the day saw FC UNITED of MANCHESTER take a point at STOCKSBRIDGE and BUXTON win at NANTWICH TOWN.

There appears to be no holding First Division leaders LANCASTER CITY at the moment and they made it a dozen league wins on the bounce with a 4-2 success against OSSETT ALBION to keep their six point cushion as nearest rivals COLWYN BAY scraped home 1-0 at WARRINGTON TOWN. Two wins in the week over BAMBER BRIDGE who lost their unbeaten home record in the second of those enabled FC HALIFAX TOWN to climb to third with the two other top five clubs, CURZON ASHTON and SKELMERSDALE UNITED, battling out a 1-1 draw. These five have now drawn six points clear of sixth place club LEIGH GENESIS surprisingly going down at HARROGATE RAILWAY who lifted themselves off bottom rung with that success to be replaced by ROSSENDALE UNITED who are still searching for a first away win after their defeat at WAKEFIELD.

The top of the First Division South is really tight with just four points covering the top eight teams as CHASETOWN hit the summit thanks to a 2-1 win at WITTON ALBION. After winning in midweek RUSHALL OLYMPIC had gone top but dropped back again to third when surprisingly beaten by SHEPSHED DYNAMO and so congested is it that last Saturday's leaders KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC are now fifth after losing at MICKLEOVER SPORTS who, in addition to maintaining their unbeaten home record, move up to second. With two draws in the week GLAPWELL drop out of the play-off places to be replaced by SHEFFIELD. Elsewhere LEEK TOWN kept their unbeaten home record with a draw against MARKET DRAYTON TOWN but SPALDING UNITED and QUORN are still looking for their first away wins after losing on the road again at LINCOLN UNITED and BELPER TOWN respectively.

LOWE HITS 500 MARK FOR CURZON ASHTON

Curzon Ashton manager Gary Lowe took charge of his side for the 500th time in today's game against Skelmersdale United in what is his tenth season at the Tameside club. During his tenure Curzon have reached two North West Counties League Cup Finals, participated in an FA Vase semi-final, achieved promotion to the UniBond League, been involved in the play-offs for promotion to the Premier Division in both the last two seasons and last term beat Football League opposition in Exeter City as they made it through to the 2nd Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time in the club's history. Club Chairman Harry Galloway said "His unwavering commitment, hard work, expertise and enthusiasm have been major factors in the progress this club has made during his time in office and we are looking forward to him leading us in to the UniBond League Premier Division".

MARINE SIGN NORTHERN IRELAND INTERNATIONAL

Marine have signed former Northern Ireland international Lee McEvelly who first rose to attention in the UniBond League with Burscough in 2000. His goals for the "Linnets" earned Burscough a transfer fee of £20,000 when Rochdale came in for him during 2001 and in April 2002 he made his only international appearance against Spain.

SIR TREVOR BROOKING BECOMES SHEFFIELD LIFE MEMBER

Sir Trevor Brooking is the latest well known football name to accept Life Membership of UniBond League First Division South club Sheffield FC. He joins an impressive list of major names in the game such as Sepp Blatter, Sir Bobby Charlton and Sir Geoff Hurst to have become Life Members of the acknowledged oldest club in the world.

CONNERTON INTEREST SPREADS

As the January transfer window draws to a close interest in Lancaster City hot shot Jordan Connerton is beginning to spread wider with League Two title chasing Rochdale the latest to keep tabs on the First Division North's leading goalscorer. Going in to today's game at home to Ossett Albion the twenty year old striker was just one goal shy of the thirty mark and if his dream move of breaking in to the full time game doesn't materialise then he is left with the target of breaking the all time Lancaster City goalscoring record of 36 to aim for – a figure he should easily achieve if he doesn't sign for a full time club and steers clear of serious injury.

Rochdale Youth team boss Tony Ellis was at last Saturday's game against Salford City and saw Connerton score in a 4-1 win that kept the Giant Axe side top of the table. Other League Two sides Morecambe and Crewe Alexandra are also believed to be interested in Connerton as are Scottish outfit Motherwell who were the first to be alert to his goalscoring prowess.

MOSSLEY APPEAL FOR HELP

Mossley, FA Trophy Finalists in 1980, are appealing for financial help after their home ground at Seel Park has been effectively closed for safety reasons. New Year's Eve saw two of their eight floodlight pylons collapse under the weight of snow and strong winds. The club called in the Local Authority Health and Safety officers and an independent structural report on the surviving pylons was commissioned but the company involved couldn't make an inspection until the abnormal amount of snow in the area had cleared.

The subsequent inspection on 20th January revealed the remaining pylons to also be unsafe and until further notice all home games will have to take place away from Seel Park. Due to time constraints the League postponed Saturday's home fixture against Woodley Sports but has ordered Mossley to ensure they have alternative venues for all future home fixtures whilst the League's Board of Directors will consider allowing earlier kick offs for Saturday fixtures once the pylons have been lowered and are no longer a hazard.

The estimated cost of work involved in replacing the towers is around the £30,000 mark and with the club having faced serious financial troubles twelve months ago it is now run by a voluntary committee who have raised sufficient funds to pay current liabilities and keep to agreements reached with the creditors it inherited. The amount required to replace the floodlights is therefore well beyond the voluntary committee's means and they are asking for help to ensure that Mossley continues to have a football team. LEAGUE CHALLENGE CUP

Midweek saw two more clubs join Boston United, twice winners of the League Challenge Cup in the seventies, in the last eight of this season's competition when Premier Division leaders Retford United hit Shepshed Dynamo for six and Kendal Town accounted for Burscough. With five places still to be decided Lancaster City, the only club to have retained the trophy with wins in 2000 and 2001, will be trying for a third success when they host Ashton United on Tuesday whilst no other club left in the competition have won it although Stocksbridge PS and Whitby Town who meet on Tuesday have both been beaten finalists along with Leek Town who play host to Curzon Ashton.
