REVIEW OF THE WEEK

Premier Division leaders BRADFORD PARK AVENUE appeared to have their unbeaten away record in safe keeping when they went two up at rivals NORTH FERRIBY UNITED on Tuesday only to be shell shocked with a four goal come back by Ferriby. Normal service, however, was resumed at the weekend when Avenue hit seven against bottom club DURHAM CITY to finish the week five points clear of RETFORD UNITED who were held to a 1-1 draw at home by MATLOCK TOWN. Third place BOSTON UNITED were frozen off whilst NORTH FERRIBY UNITED, in fourth, again had to come back from two goals down this time against HUCKNALL TOWN but could only manage to grab a point on this occasion in what was a fiery ending with two players from both sides being dismissed in stoppage time with Hucknall's Wiigins-Thomas having already departed the scene earlier. It was a topsy-turvy week for fifth place GUISELEY who beat WHITBY TOWN in midweek 3-1 only to go down by the same score line at BUXTON on Saturday. With all the top six dropping points during the week KENDAL TOWN continued to make ground with a win at NANTWICH TOWN who are not having a good time of it at present having also lost at BURSCOUGH on Tuesday. At the opposite end FRICKLEY ATHLETIC registered only their second win on the road when beating WORKSOP TOWN and they moved above their victims who are now only one place off the relegation places. Frickley, however, couldn't maintain the momentum at the weekend going down at home to a resurgent FC UNITED of MANCHESTER.

LANCASTER CITY went six points clear at the top of the First Division North with maximum points from their two games but nearest rivals COLWYN BAY and FC HALIFAX TOWN kept on their heels as both won their only games of the week. Fourth placed SKELMERSDALE UNITED, however, after beating BAMBER BRIDGE 4-1 on Tuesday crashed by the same score at home to AFC Fylde on Saturday with Matt Walwyn grabbing a hat-trick. Bottom club ROSSENDALE UNITED scored more than two goals in a league game this season for the first time on Wednesday but still managed to lose 4-3 at LEIGH GENESIS and their dismal away form continued with a 2-1 defeat at CLITHEROE on Saturday.

The First Division South bore the brunt of the weekend weather losing half its fixtures but the week closed as you were at the head of affairs with all the top four winning. Both MICKLEOVER SPORTS and BELPER TOWN won 4-1 whilst GLAPWELL enjoyed a 3-1 success at WITTON ALBION who dropped a place as a result of that set back. Frozen off on Saturday, fourth place SHEFFIELD FC had picked up three points with a midweek win against CAMMELL LAIRD. After a slow start to 2010 KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC are now beginning to fire on all cylinders again and hit bottom club WILLENHALL TOWN for seven to go above Witton in to sixth. Midweek saw QUORN end a run of five successive defeats with victory at home to GRANTHAM TOWN but their away record again let them down at the weekend and they are still searching for their first three pointer of the campaign on their travels after losing at CAMMELL LAIRD.

COURT DECISION GOES AGAINST ASHTON UNITED

Ashton United have been hit with a hammer blow after the High Court found against the club and its player Danny White in a claim made by Marcus Hallows of Altrincham from a tackle in a Conference North fixture five years ago. Club Chairman David Aspinall said "This verdict opens a potential can of worms for every single football club up and down the land as, based on the precedent set in this case, any incident resulting in an injury may now be subject to a legal challenge, regardless of the lack of any intent. Speaking as someone deeply committed to the game of football, I fully understanding Marcus Hallows' wish to seek redress for the unfortunate injury that he suffered in a challenge with Danny White during the game between Altrincham and Ashton United on March 19th 2005, however, Ashton United FC always felt that, as Mr Hallows' injuries were suffered as the result of an accidental collision between two consenting adults playing a sport with a known degree of risk, no liability was owed by either Danny White or Ashton United for a genuine, if unfortunate, accident. The club will not be making any further comment until it has consulted with its legal advisors about the potential ramifications for both Ashton United and Danny White following this verdict".

POINTS DEDUCTION IMPLEMENTED

Durham City this week announced that the club would not be appealing against the six point deduction imposed by the Football Association details of which were in last week's Press release. As a result of Durham's decision not to appeal the League has accordingly implemented the points deduction as from today.

Last October the Football Association also imposed an immediate five point deduction on Curzon Ashton. The Tameside club lodged an appeal against that decision and after a four month delay the case will now be heard next Friday, 26th February.

LEIGH STARLET PICKS UP ENGLAND HONOURS

Leigh Genesis starlet Dale Whitham has been rewarded for his impressive form this season with a call-up to the ESFA England Under 18's squad, a historic breeding ground for top-class footballers both past and present.

The 17 year old who is a sixth form pupil in Ashton on Mersey, has scored three goals in twenty eight appearances for Genesis this season and will face Spanish-based games against Gibraltar and Malaga over the next week with a view to facing Wales, Northern Ireland, Scotland and the Republic of Ireland in a tournament at the end of April. His international call up meant that he missed last Saturday's 2-0 win over Clitheroe along with his side's 4-3 midweek victory over Rossendale United but will boost a growing footballing CV that now includes forty six senior appearances, a terrific achievement for someone who doesn't celebrate his eighteenth birthday until later this month.

MOSSLEY FLOODLIGHT THANK YOU

Mossley, two of whose floodlight pylons collapsed in the snow and gales over the Christmas holiday period causing the other pylons to be condemned, have announced that work will start on a replacement system within the new few weeks once planning permission has been obtained. The comparative swift reversal of fortunes has come about due to the generosity of the residents and supporters of Mossley along with much appreciated donations from around the non-league scene. Some £4,500 has been raised towards the replacement system to be installed with the short fall being made good by local businessman Gary Threlkeld, a Mossley resident, of GT Grafix. A club spokesman said "The club would also like to place on record our grateful appreciation to our friends and neighbours at Ashton United for their fantastic support in allowing us to use their facilities in our hour of need".

EIGHT YEARS LATE

Striker Lee Morris has finally joined Buxton nearly eight years after almost signing for them! Buxton boss John Reed dipped in to the transfer market to sign the 28 year old from rivals Frickley Athletic to complete a move that might have happened eight years ago. Then, however, Morris opted to sign for Frickley and quickly became a force in the goalscoring charts before other stints at Wakefield, Harrogate Town and Stalybridge Celtic before returning to Frickley in the summer of 2006.

KENDAL STRETCH HOME RECORD TO A YEAR

Kendal Town's victory over North Ferriby United last Saturday stretched their unbeaten home record to a year with their last defeat at Parkside Road coming on 21st February 2009 at the hands of FC United of Manchester.

NANTWICH SOLVE 'KEEPER PROBLEMS WITH LOAN

Nantwich Town Head Coach Peter Hall has solved his club's goalkeeping crisis by signing highly rated Port Vale first team squad member 19 year old Daniel Lloyd-Weston. The former West Bromwich Albion trainee has been pushing hard for a first team spot at Vale but is being kept out by current number one Chris Martin and, with reserve custodian Joe Anyon back after injury, Port Vale boss Micky Adams is keen for Lloyd-Weston to get some games under his belt.

The crisis came about following a neck injury to Ben Chapman that held up last Saturday's fixture against Frickley Athletic for some twenty minutes. Fortunately X-Rays revealed Chapman had not sustained any broken bones.
