REVIEW OF THE WEEK

STOCKSBRIDGE PS went back to the top of the table in midweek when they won at BURSCOUGH but despite adding another three goals to their impressive home tally on Saturday they were outscored by MATLOCK TOWN for whom Ross Hannah hit a hat-trick. Surprise package ASHTON UNITED moved up to second after maintaining their 100% away record with a 4-3 win at MARINE in midweek and then, back on home soil at the weekend, they inflicted a first league defeat of the campaign on RETFORD UNITED who had a bad week as they also went out of the FA Cup to lower tier LINCOLN UNITED. Previous leaders KENDAL TOWN dropped to third after conceding four at HUCKNALL TOWN who are up to sixth just ahead on goal difference from BOSTON UNITED who made it four home draws out of four with a goalless game against WHITBY TOWN after another stalemate in midweek at BRADFORD PARK AVENUE. Up into fourth after two wins in the week are GUISELEY who accounted for NANTWICH TOWN at home on Tuesday and then travelled to FC UNITED of MANCHESTER to secure a 2-1 victory. The final play-off spot goes to BURSCOUGH who are one of four teams on fourteen points and they recovered from their home midweek defeat to beat OSSETT TOWN on their travels. At the opposite end of the table WORKSOP TOWN won their first game of the season when beating MARINE whilst BRADFORD PARK AVENUE's defeat at KINGS LYNN sees them drop in to the relegation places after FRICKLEY ATHLETIC overcame BUXTON. However, the bottom of the table is so tight approaching the quarter way stage of the league season that only two points separates next to bottom Worksop from eleventh place Retford!

FC HALIFAX TOWN continue to set a hot pace in the First Division North winning at bottom club SALFORD CITY in midweek and then beating LEIGH GENESIS. They are two points clear with a game in hand on COLWYN BAY who also enjoyed six points in the week but third place CURZON ASHTON lost ground when they went down on Saturday at WARRINGTON TOWN after hitting five on Monday against CHORLEY. Two wins without conceding a goal puts BAMBER BRIDGE up to fourth ahead of LANCASTER CITY who were mugged in stoppage time at WAKEFIELD with the latter scoring both their goals in added time. SKELMERSDALE UNITED are just outside the play-offs after being held at home by OSSETT ALBION who had secured their first three pointer of the campaign on Tuesday at the expense of MOSSLEY who lost again at the weekend to bottom club SALFORD CITY for whom it was also a first league victory. Next to bottom ROSSENDALE UNITED failed to score in two games and with both GARFORTH TOWN and WOODLEY SPORTS also sealing first league wins of the season on Tuesday things are looking bleak for Rossy who have only found the net four times in seven league outings.

Table topping LEEK TOWN held on to the leadership of the First Division South with a narrow 1-0 win over visitors SPALDING UNITED who still search for a first win but two wins in the week have enabled RUSHALL OLYMPIC to close the gap on the leaders to two points with a game in hand. Newcomers MARKET DRAYTON TOWN continue to impress and after matching free scoring KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC all the way in a six goal encounter in midweek they hit four against QUORN to move in to third. After losing in midweek at SHEFFIELD FC, WITTON ALBION bounced back to winning ways on Saturday with a 2-0 success over SHEPSHED DYNAMO and are fourth level on points with SHEFFIELD who were held at BELPER TOWN at the weekend. Sixth place KIDSGROVE ATHLETIC are still unbeaten after repeating their 3-3 midweek scoreline five days later at STAMFORD with Matt Haddrell notching a treble in the latter game. BRIGG TOWN enjoyed a fantastic week shattering CARLTON TOWN's unbeaten home record and then banging in five without reply against WILLENHALL TOWN but, despite knocking Premier Division side Retford United out of the FA Cup, LINCOLN UNITED are still without a win in the league after being within touching distance of it at CAMMELL LAIRD who scored twice in stoppage time to reverse a 1-0 deficit.

FRICKLEY'S SHIRTLIFFE MOURNED

Former Frickley Athletic full-back and England semi-pro international Paul Shirtliff passed away last Sunday after a long battle against cancer. He was just 46 years of age. Fans and Club Officials alike will remember him as part of the Blues' most successful ever side that finished runners-up in the Gola League (Conference) and reached the 3rd Round of the FA Cup. Paul was twice voted Supporters Player of the Year and featured prominently for the England non-league side whilst at Frickley and also at Boston United where he subsequently moved to. Indeed, he was one of England's most capped players at this level of the game with fifteen appearances at a time when the side did not play as many games as nowadays.

Paul began his career as an apprentice at Sheffield Wednesday and he went on to make 7 Football League appearances for the Owls before moving to Northampton Town in July 1984 where he played 27 League games during the 1984/85 season.

He then signed for Frickley in August 1985, playing over 150 games for the club in a three-year spell at Westfield Lane before being signed by Boston United in June 1988 for a then club record fee of £12,500. In those three years Paul helped the Blues to a highest ever League finish and an incredible FA Cup run to the Third Round Proper against Rotherham United in January 1986. He was voted Supporters Player of the Year in the 1986/87 and 1987/88 seasons. He spent four seasons at Boston United before moving on to Dagenham & Redbridge where he played over 30 games in the 1992/93 season and finally Gateshead before he moved in to coaching.

FA CUP

Despite losing only six out of twenty ties against outside opposition in the First Qualifying Round of the FA Cup the UniBond League will have two less clubs contesting the next stage of the competition next weekend than it had last season. This is due to the fact that no fewer than thirteen UniBond clubs knocked out fellow member clubs and there are again six all UniBond ties in the 2nd Qualifying Round where the teams are playing for prize money of £4,500 each. Within this half dozen there are two all Premier Division meetings as KENDAL TOWN and NORTH FERRIBY UNITED host OSSETT TOWN and FC UNITED of MANCHESTER respectively whilst First Division clubs WARRINGTON and RADCLIFFE BOROUGH also meet. The other three ties see top tier clubs ASHTON UNITED, BUXTON and GUISELEY meet First Division North opposition with only Ashton having to travel (to CHORLEY) whilst the others host AFC FYLDE and BAMBER BRIDGE respectively. Elsewhere UniBond clubs take on Conference North sides in no fewer than eight ties.

FYLDE SIGN NOWLAND

League newcomers AFC Fylde have signed Adam Nowland who has played at the second highest level of the game in the country. The 28 year old started his career with Blackpool but left to join Wimbledon in 2001 before big money moves to West Ham and Nottingham Forest. He then joined Preston in 2005 but broke his leg after a handful of games and following a long spell on the sidelines went on loan to Gillingham and Stockport County. He signed for Notts County in July 2008 and made 21 appearances in League 2 but was released in the summer returning to play a couple of trial games this season with Blackpool scoring on his second debut for the club in the Coca Cola cup tie against Crewe in August. Nowland made over two hundred appearances in his full time career and Club President David Haythornthwaite said "I was always a fan of Adam's when he played for Blackpool and I sponsored him as a 17 year old starting out on his career. I'm delighted we have had the opportunity to bring someone with Adam's quality to the club"

GENESIS IN FOR GBEMIE

Leigh Genesis boss Garry Flitcroft has boosted his ranks with the signing of former Bolton Wanderers Academy player David Gbemie. The Liberian-born nineteen year old Gbemie made numerous appearances for Bolton's reserve side last season whilst also spending a period in the Conference North on loan at Burscough, playing in defence alongside ex-Leigh players Jonathan Goulding and Josh Wilson.

GREENWOOD COMPLETES HALF A CENTURY

Last weekend saw Rushall Olympic Club President Brian Greenwood complete fifty years service to the club with Brian Adshead, Chief Executive of the Staffs FA presenting him with an FA Long Service award. His first connection with the club was as a player in 1959 going on to make just short of five hundred appearances.

During the peak of his career he was a key member of the Rushall Olympic side who had become one of the powerhouses of football in Staffordshire during the 1960's when the Staffordshire County League South Division One Championship was clinched in seasons 1960-61, 61-62, 62-63 and 64-65. Meanwhile, a plethora of Cup successes were also claimed, that included the likes of the Walsall Senior Cup, Sporting Star Cup, Lichfield Charity Cup, J.W. Edge Cup, Walsall Memorial Charity Cup and Wednesbury Senior Cup - some of which were won on several occasions each. When his playing career finally came to an end he enjoyed a one season spell as team manager before turning his attentions to Rushall Olympic's off the field activities and became a member of the club committee in the role of Chairman after previous incumbent Arthur Steed stood down.

During that era the club moved rapidly forward both on and off the pitch from Rushall's Rowley Place to the Aston University Sports Ground in 1975. Brian was one of the fondly remembered Rushall Olympic "Magnificent Seven" that also included Trevor Westwood, Mick Clayton, Graham Wiggan, Johnny Edwards, Brian Humphries - who all joined forces and enlisted the help of Councillor Dick Arkell to obtain the lease of some land in Daw End, Rushall, to eventually mastermind the Pics return to the village at their current Dales Lane home in 1977 - and the rest, as they say, is history.

ALBION STRENGTHEN OFF FIELD TEAM

Witton Albion have received a major off-field boost with the recruitment of two new directors, a new football secretary and commercial manager. Signing on at Wincham Park as directors are Ernie Fryer and Dr Vijay Anthwal. Anthwal is a well known figure locally, and has been the Albion club doctor for many years. He has been handed responsibility for developing better links with other community bodies. Fryer is a very well known figure on the non-league scene, having previously been a director at Wigan Athletic, Northwich Victoria and Altrincham, the latter alongside Albion's chairman Mark Harris. Fryer's remit is to support the club's fundraising activities through his contacts and to bring his 30 plus years experience to bear.

Albion's new club secretary is Graham Shuttleworth, who joins from Curzon Ashton where he spent 12 years and helped mastermind that club's new stadium development. Graham takes over the reins of club secretary held jointly by Peter Riley and Jeff Metcalf since the departure of Graham Edgeley over a year ago. Both will remain actively involved, Riley in his accustomed role as Matchday Secretary. Completing the quartet of arrivals is Commercial Manager Malcolm Hewitt, who will work closely alongside Commercial Director Graham Pickering.

Welcoming all four to the club, chairman Mark Harris said "We have known for some time that key areas of the club needed strengthening. Vijay Anthwal is a true Wittoner who will bring a new dimension to the board, as will Ernie who brings both energy and experience. Malcolm Hewitt will help energise our sales and marketing activities at a time when it is harder than ever to attract sponsors and advertisers. Like players and managers, these appointments take time to bed down, and we need to achieve continuity. However I'm sure that Malcolm and Graham will make a formidable team."

The Albion chairman was also delighted to have secured the services of one of the most experienced administrators in the league in Graham Shuttleworth, but paid tribute to both Peter Riley and Jeff Metcalf for their dedication, "We've never replaced Graham Edgeley since he stepped down as football secretary last summer. Peter and Jeff have worked miracles in dealing with the volume and complexities of tasks thrown at them, but neither wanted to take on the full role. It was important that in appointing Graham we could free up Peter and Jeff to concentrate on some of the many other challenges facing the club."

"Graham Shuttleworth brings us tremendous knowledge, not only of football administration, but of grant applications and stadium re-development. Although our discussions in this direction are at a very early stage, his expertise will be invaluable."
